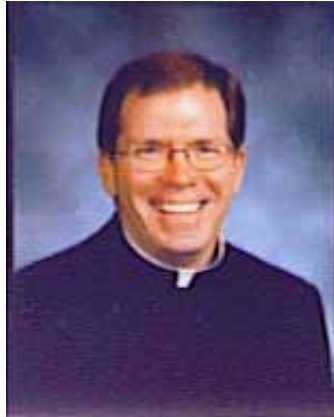

Every year, the Stations of the Cross come alive for the students of St. John's. "This activity allows our students to see that people are still misjudged and are suffering in our society," said 5th grade teacher Mrs. Wineman.
